Louisa H. Stone Honored with Greenwich Land Trust's First Lifetime Achievement Award

(Greenwich, CT) – At its 2013 annual meeting, The Greenwich Land Trust honored Louisa Haskell Stone with its first-ever Lifetime Achievement Award for decades of service to conservation in the Greenwich community. Mrs. Stone has been a member of the Greenwich Land Trust since its founding in the 1970s. She has served as a Board Member, Board President, and Honorary Board Member. As President, Louisa was instrumental in convincing the Board to acquire Shell Island—now one of the Land Trust's most cherished preserves. She has twice donated land to the Land Trust, created the Land Trust newsletter, and continues to serve on the Communications Committee as a writer and editor. She is also a preserve monitor, annually inspecting preserves and reporting any issues. Last year, she volunteered to co-chair the Mueller Preserve Campaign, believing that the Land Trust needed a permanent home after 37 years of successful growth. Board President Jane D. Hogeman enthusiastically presented the achievement award to Mrs. Stone in front of three generations of Mrs. Stone's family and 150 Land Trust members.

The Greenwich Land Trust's mission is to preserve land permanently and protect its ecological integrity for the benefit of this and future generations. The GLT, founded in 1976, preserves more than 739 acres of land including woodlands, meadows, orchards, and salt marshes. Membership is open to all.
