Greenwich Land Trust and Wildlife in Crisis (WIC) have had a fruitful partnership for over a decade. Recently, GLT staff spent some time at WIC's facility in Weston, CT where they got a first-hand look at the amazing work performed by the organization.

WIC is a non-profit organization dedicated to wildlife preservation. They rescue injured and orphaned wildlife and seek to protect threatened ecosystems. WIC's ultimate goal is to return rehabilitated wildlife back to the wild. As a general rule, WIC releases wildlife back to the areas from which they were originally rescued, and many of these injured or orphaned animals come from Greenwich.

Through our partnership, GLT's nature preserves have come to serve as permanent homes and rich habitat for many of WIC's rehabilitated animals. WIC staff release wildlife at GLT events and



educational programs to give the community a unique view of these incredible creatures. They also provide our guests with information on keeping wildlife safe from human disturbance. Our partnership with WIC provides educational and inspiring experiences for all, and we are proud to call them a partner.
